CURRENT INITIATIVES & *PROJECTS*

COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKERS TRAINING Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) funding goes to train and upskill Community Health Workers (CHWs), addressing health equity within rural and underserviced communities in Indiana.

LOCAL MOBILE PANTRY DATA COLLECTION

Staff and students are working to develop a data collection tool to aid in tracking clients as well as lead to increased funding in areas of necessary growth. The data collected also aids organizers in managing their inventory to plan future pantry operations.

LOCAL NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION DATA TOOL DEVELOPMENT & DATA COLLECTION

Development of data collection tool and data evalutation, as well as message formation for presentation to funders and stakeholders is being accomplished by staff and students. The goal is to have realtime data to understand trends and present useful data to administrators.
