My primary research interests center around a classic topic in empirical social psychology, that of small group performance and interaction. Much of my empirical and theoretical work focuses on the effects of moods and emotions and on temporal constraints (e.g., time limits or time pressure) on group performance and interaction. More recent work explores information exchange in groups (e.g., being "out of the loop") and issues of inclusion/exclusion. Additional interests include various gender-related issues, including gender-emotion stereotypes, sexual harassment, and sexuality.
