

Space

Faculty

- For now, faculty will have dedicated on-campus offices to fulfill our learning mission – residential education.
- This will be difficult to maintain if faculty do not return to campus.
- Please consider working on campus daily to be available to welcome and mentor our new colleagues.
- To integrate new colleagues, please conduct faculty meetings, primary committee meetings in person.

Future of Work

- New office space guidelines have been announced.
- Propose that staff and graduate students who do not work on campus daily will no longer have dedicated office spaces, but instead will have hoteling spaces.

Research Space

- HHS is 40% short of research space.
- Efforts to advocate for additional research space are meeting with mixed success.
- Sharing research space is becoming more common all new or renovated research space will likely be shared.

Resources

HHS Budget Request – mixed outcome so far

- New faculty lines for enrollment growth will hear in May
- Future Faculty Fellows not supported, will consider other strategies
- Additional graduate assistantships 6.0 FTE funded
- Funds to renovate research space not supported, will continue to ask



Development Update

Projection for FY 2021-2022 is \$29 million

- Fiscal year to date (~10.5 months)
 - \$26.5 million total raised by HHS (planned giving, cash gifts, etc.)
 - \$17.1 million in cash raised by HHS
 - Both figures are the largest amounts raised in any year in HHS history
- 2022-2023 Fundraising Priorities
 - Rising Star Professorships
 - Named Deanship
 - Student scholarships
 - Nursing and Pharmacy Education Building: ~40% of the \$98 million projected cost has already been raised
 - Center for Early Learning



HHS raised \$196,067 via 438 individual donations on Purdue Day of Giving!

Winter Flex/Winter Session

Proposed to enhance academic innovation and student success

- January Term proposal was revised in response to faculty feedback
- Winter Session/Winter Flex proposal passed the University Senate with 79% approval
- Winter Flex will begin as a three week term between the fall and spring semesters, which for now remain at 16 weeks
- Winter 2022-2023 Study Abroad only
- Starting Winter 2023-2024 Study Abroad + Asynchronous Online Classes Financial aid will be available for students who wish to participate
- Faculty and graduate student leaders/instructors will be compensated as overload
- In collaboration with University Senate, may consider moving to 15-week semesters: Faculty and graduate students would be under contract two weeks before the Fall and Spring semesters would begin, to allow additional time for class preparation and orientation activities and Winter Session could become 4 weeks
- Faculty and graduate student compensation would not change
- Thirteen weeks of summer would remain
