Capstone Experience 6-8 credits

Students must propose their capstone plan and receive Undergraduate Committee (Capstone Subcommittee) approval. All capstones must be clearly relevant to the major.

If the student is completing a concentration, the capstone experience must have a clear connection to the student's designated concentration. If a student chooses to complete more than one concentration, the capstone experience must have a clear connection to <u>all</u> of the student's designated concentrations.
