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Description

HHS Connex is an undergraduate program in the College of Health and Human Sciences that fosters community, belonging, and allyship through academic, social, and professional development events and activities.

HHS Connex was first offered in 2022-2023, and it is the college's version of the Multicultural Science Program, Minority Engineering Program, and Business Opportunity Program.



Program Goals

Foster community, belonging, and allyship by

- Increasing formal and informal mentoring, along with opportunities for personal and academic networking.
- Offering leadership opportunities and ways to engage with the college (e.g. attending events, offering suggestions, and engaging with HHS Undergraduate DEI Committee and Working Groups).
- Partnering with college and campus units and organizations to support students and provide resources.

Academic Year Programming

- Open to all HHS undergraduate students.
- Events include annual Ice Cream Social and Undergraduate Research Advice and Opportunities.
- Other events change, such as Narcan Training, Financial Wellness, and Bias in the Healthcare Professions.
- Participation ranges from 8-100+ students per event.
- Many events offered in collaboration with HHS and Purdue units, Cultural Centers, or student organizations.

Summer Experience Program

- Includes HHS Emerging Leader Scholars who opt into Early Start and other new beginners who apply.
 - 16 in 2023
 - 21 in 2024
- Students take common courses such as PSY 120, ENGL 106, and COM 114, etc.
- Peer mentors (1:5 ratio) provide guidance and support. Mentors are HHS students who are interviewed, selected, and supervised.
- 5 college-specific events that help students develop relationships; network with faculty, staff, and administrators; engage with alumni; learn about research; prepare for the fall.
