

HHS New Faculty Hiring

Talent-based hiring: The targeted recruiting of top faculty through the Moveable Dream Hires program has shown early success, with 28 notable faculty of extremely high caliber *across all career stages* recruited in the last two years. The program works best as an ongoing, evergreen, *entirely bottom-up-driven* hiring opportunity for outstanding talent and will continue seamlessly into next year's hiring as a 24/7/365 mechanism for bringing top talent to Purdue. HHS authorized for 9 hires currently

Topic-based hiring: Broad pools across multiple career stages: Enlarging candidate pools with broad searches is an emphasis. HHS authorized for 1 TT/5 CP searches for West Lafayette duty station, and 2 TT/3 CP searches for Indianapolis duty station.

One Health Cluster Search: HHS is authorized for 3 hires

Research

Sponsored Programs (Purdue WL Only)

- Proposals 4,262 (up 143 or 3.5% from 4,119), \$3.04B (up \$119M or 4.1% from \$2.93B)
 - **HHS Proposals** 287 (down 24 or 7.7% from 311 last year); \$197M (down \$14K or 0.01% from \$197M last year)
- Awards \$555.2M (down \$175.5M or 24% from \$730.7M)
 - **HHS Awards** \$24.4M (down \$29.9M or 55.1% from \$54.3M last year). This is a major drop from the FY record set in FY24.
- Expenditures \$706.6M (up \$116.2M or 19.7% from \$590.4M)
 - **HHS Expenditures** \$45.6M (up \$7.4M or 19.4% from \$38.2M last year). Another FY record for HHS – old record was \$38.2M in FY24. HHS had the 2nd largest % increase of all colleges, after Business.




How many have joined the research registry?

NUMBER OF REGISTRANTS




20.7% of shared registrants have enrolled in a study.


